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**Dover High School Family Information Update  
April 11, 2018**

Third Quarter Report Cards were distributed in Advisory this morning. We especially ask families of seniors to review these with your student(s) to make sure they are staying on schedule for graduation. Report cards are also posted on our Parent Portal.

The Dover School Board approved Friday, June 22<sup>nd</sup> as the last day of school for students. The last day for teaching staff will be Monday, June 25<sup>th</sup>.

April is Alcohol Awareness Month. As we enter this season of celebration, we ask that you have candid conversations with your students around alcohol use, its dangers, and potential consequences students could face. Attached is a letter generated by the Dover Coalition of Youth that addresses underage drinking.

The DMS Drama Club will be presenting “Shrek the Musical” April 12<sup>th</sup> -14<sup>th</sup> at 7:00pm and April 15<sup>th</sup> at 2:00pm in the Frederick C. Walker Auditorium at Dover High School. Tickets are \$5 for adults and \$3 for children. They are on sale now at the DMS office and will be available at the door.

On Tuesday, April 17<sup>th</sup> at 6:30 pm the School Counseling Department will be hosting an Early College Information Night for parents of students in Grades 9 through 11 in the Frederick C. Walker Auditorium. This presentation helps families navigate the financial aid process, including the FAFSA, while exploring the types of aid and scholarships available to students.

Sign-ups have begun for students to take the ASVAB (Armed Service Vocational Aptitude Battery) on April 17<sup>th</sup> from 7:45-11:00am. The ASVAB is hosted by the military as it a military entrance exam however anybody can take this career exploration inventory. If your plans include college, working, or military after high school or if you are unsure what you want to do, the ASVAB can help you find a career field that may be a good fit for you. The School Counseling Department will be hosting their annual college fair on Wednesday, April 18<sup>th</sup> during 4th block (1:00-2:30) on the mezzanine. Over 35 college admissions representatives will be on hand to speak to students.

On Saturday May 12<sup>th</sup> from 9:00 am to 11:30 am the 2018 New Hampshire Military Service Academy Day will be held at the New Hampshire Army National Guard Regional Training Institute located at 722 Riverwood Drive in Pembroke, NH. This day is designed for students who are interested in obtaining Service Academy Nominations from the New Hampshire Congressional delegation. The New Hampshire Higher Assistance Foundation (NHHEAF) will be hosting Summer Boot Camp workshops, led by college counselors, to help rising high school seniors embark upon the college admissions process in a relaxed, small-group setting with the support of college counselors. Registration is required (see dates on flyers) and all workshops are held at NHHEAF's Concord campus. The cost is \$25 per workshop.

The University of New Hampshire's Tech Camp has a set of summer programs for students entering grades 6 through 12 designed to increase STEM literacy. The programs engage young people in interactive, hands-on, problem solving activities in the areas of science, technology, engineering and mathematics (STEM). UNH Tech Camp is offered by the College of Engineering and Physical Sciences at the University of New Hampshire and makes available the benefits of the UNH research campus to the community-at-large. The Tech Leaders program runs from July 16 through July 27, and a girls only week runs July 9 through July 13<sup>th</sup>. This is a wonderful program to inspire and support girls who are thinking of or are already in the STEM pathways. See the attached flyers for more information.

### **Repeated Information**

On Monday evening the Dover School Board approved June 14, 2018 as the date for the Class of 2020's Graduation Exercises. Graduation will take place at 7:00 pm at the Whittemore Center on the campus of the University of New Hampshire. Weather impacts the date that is selected for graduation. School Board Policy and New Hampshire Department of Education regulations state that the school year for seniors cannot be reduced by more than five days. With seven snow days, we will request a waiver for two of the days because we will still exceed the Department of Education's requirement for 990 hours of instructional time. In selecting the date, we also work with Somersworth High School and Oyster River High School so that we can save money on set-up costs. The calendar and paperwork for senior activities will be put out in April.
